SCHOOL-WIDE EXPECTAIONS: Be safe, Be caring, Be respectful

NAME OF THE SKILL: Hands Off

Purpose of the lesson and why it is important:

- 1. Safety is a good thing
- 2. To teach children to keep their hands to themselves
- 3. To teach children about personal space

Teaching Examples:

- 1. You want to grab your friends arm to get her/his attention, but you remember that you must keep your hands to yourself. You decide to call her/his name instead.
- 2. When you accidentally bump into someone, make sure that you excuse yourself and apologize even though it may have been an accident.
- 3. If someone does bump into you, or accidentally hurts you, still—hands off. Use words, not hands.

Kid Activities/ Role Play

- 1. Role- play conflict resolution situations
- 2. Discuss different things you can say or do
- 3. Brainstorm dangerous situations when you need to tell an adult immediately

Follow Up and Reinforcement Activities:

- 1. Verbally praise and give gotcha's for students that keep their hands to themselves.
- 2. Precorrect before recess, lining up and dismissal.
