- approved the certificate of tax levy resolution for the 2017 levy in the amounts of: Education Fund, \$23,975,000; Operations & Maintenance Fund, \$3,213,500; Transportation Fund, \$1,365,000; Working Cash Fund, \$315,000; Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund, \$250,000; Social Security Fund, \$512,500; Tort Immunity Fund, \$225,000; Special Education Fund, \$465,000; and Bond and Interest Fund, for a total levy in the amount of \$30,321,000;
- authorized the Board President to sign the certification of compliance with the Truth in Taxation Act for the 2017 levy;
- authorized the Superintendent to execute contacts for the purchase of natural gas and electricity;
- authorized the completion of the Dr. Julian Rogus School wireless access points project;
- approved the Superintendent evaluation process;
