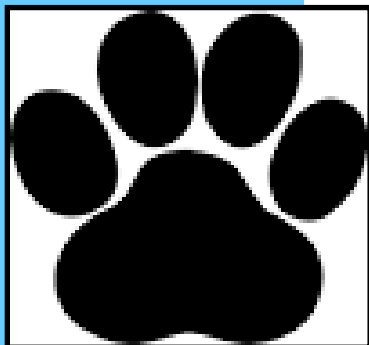


## Our School Improvement Plan

## Demographics

Hilda Walker Intermediate School serves over 700 fifth and sixth grade students who reside in Frankfort, Mokena, and Tinley Park. Walker was built in 1996 and earned the prestigious Blue Ribbon School of Excellence from the U.S. Department of Education in 2000-2001.
